  - i. NOTE: The entire title is "Ancient Faiths Embodied in Ancient Names or An Attempt to Trace The Religious Beliefs, Sacred Rites and holy emblems of certain nations by interpretation of the names given to children of priestly authority, or assumed by prophets, kings and Hierarchs".
  - ii. NOTE 2: because Inman begins looking from the pagan angle, his definitions at times emphasize that aspect more than the Scriptural texts may look upon them. He has some good insights but just be careful to not overweight him and don't use as an only resource. Still recommended just use due diligence.
