

The Mary's

The original Koine Greek text of the New Testament mentions the name *Mary* 54 times in 4 different forms: Μαρία [Maria] (18 occurrences), Μαρίαμ [Miriam, but spelled with an "a" as Mariam](27 occurrences), Μαρίας [Marian](2 occurrences), and Μαρίας [Marias](7 occurrences). The name *Mary* is found in 49 verses: in 10 cases, two different Marys are mentioned in a single verse, while in the other 39 cases, there is only one Mary in a verse.

In John 19:25 it is "Mary of Clopas", literally. It is a genitive "Clopas' Mary" would fit. BUT while typical usage of a wife it could mean Mary's father, brother, husband or even an unknown town or region. Tyndale and the KJ call him "Cleophas" but I didn't find a Greek text that spelled that? The man in Luke 24:18 is spelled CLEOPAS in the Greek. I don't think he is the same man as Clopas.
